Direct Flights to Bordeaux

Bordeaux-Mérignac (BOD) is the closest airport to Bordeaux, and it is located around 8 km from the city centre.



Trains to Bordeaux

Bordeaux's main train station is Bordeaux-Saint-Jean. As well as connecting Bordeaux with the rest of France, you can also take the train to Bordeaux from other European countries.



Best Way to Travel from Paris to Bordeaux

While flying is an option, taking the train is a faster, more convenient, and cost-effective choice. Direct trains from Paris' Gare Montparnasse to Bordeaux-Saint-Jean run frequently—about 25 per day—with a travel time of just two to three hours.
