First Symposium: Psychoneuroimmunology Expands to Ibero-America

Our first symposium, held during the FeSBE Annual Meeting, marked a significant milestone for PNIRS Ibero-America. This event was made possible through generous financing from a grant awarded to Dr. Lício Velloso from the University of Campinas (UNICAMP). Dr. Velloso is a renowned expert in metabolic diseases and their interactions with the immune system. His support has been crucial in establishing our initiative and fostering its growth.

The symposium provided a platform for distinguished speakers to share their groundbreaking research. Dr. Keith Kelley (University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign), who has been our mentor since the beginning, introduced the PNIRS Ibero-America initiative, emphasizing the importance of expanding PNI collaborations into the Ibero-America region and creating a global research network in the field. Dr. Ruth Barrientos presented her work on the mechanisms by which a Western diet induces memory deficits in the aging brain. Dr. Wilson Savino (Oswaldo Cruz Foundation), who is a member of our committee, highlighted his research on immuno-neuro-endocrine interactions in Chagas disease.

Additionally, Dr. Jacob Allen (University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign) explored how psychological stress-induced changes to intestinal epithelial cells can alter the microbiome and predispose individuals to disease. The symposium also featured Dr. Jonathan Kipnis (Washington University School of Medicine) as a keynote speaker in a separate conference, who discussed the role of brain borders in controlling brain function.

This symposium was a fantastic opportunity for the PNIRS Ibero-America team to connect with researchers in Brazil, fostering new collaborations and bringing PNIRS-affiliated scientists to the region. The partnership between the Brazilian Federation of Experimental Biology Societies and PNIRS Ibero-America promises to be mutually beneficial and highly productive.

For 2024, we are organizing two symposia in Brazil, both of which are the fruits of collaborations and networks established during our first symposium. Our organization is growing, and these events reflect our expanding influence and reach.



Third Symposium: Integrative Approaches in Psychoneuroimmunology (PNI)

Event: Congress of the Brazilian Society of Neuroscience and Behavior (SBNeC) Location: Aguas de Lindoia, Brazil Date: October 28 to November 1, 2024



Our third symposium, invited by SBNeC former president Dr. Deborah Suchecki, will showcase a range of integrative approaches in PNI. Dr. Erica Glasper (The Ohio State University) will discuss her pioneering research on the interactions among sex, social behavior, and neuro-immune interactions following early-life loss. Dr. Aline Silva de Miranda (Federal University of Minas Gerais) will present her work on inflammatory biomarkers for traumatic brain injury, highlighting current knowledge and future directions. Dr. Maria Elisa Caetano-Silva (University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign) will share insights into how psychological stress disrupts the brain-gut axis, affecting intestinal mucosal compartments and the microbiome.
