Membership

Annual Meeting 2013

Our annual meeting will be held from 5th to 8th of June in Stockholm, Sweden, at a venue that is delightfully located in a green and leafy area of Stockholm, just 5 km from the city centre with easy access to all places of interest in the Stockholm area (www.pnirs.org/meetings/index.cfm). Mats Lekander and his team from the Karolinska Institute and the University of Stockholm are doing their very best to make this meeting a great success. This meeting follows the successful structure of our previous meetings including free oral sessions, three symposia (Neurobiology of Placebo/Nocebo Responses; Sleep, Brain and Immunity; Host Defense & Psychiatric Disorders) and key note addresses from most distinguished scientists.

- March 8th: Closing date for submitting individual abstracts for oral or poster presentations; trainees must submit an
 abstract to be eligible for a scholar award
- March 31st: Last day for early bird registration
- May 27th: Online registration closes

PNIRS Scholars Award Program

As we had to learn, unfortunately the NIH cancelled the support for trainee programs in general. Thus, we will not be able to attract NIH funding for our successful trainee program. However, depending on the financial situation, as the meeting comes closer next year, the Society will be able to cover travel awards, although most probably not as extensive as in previous years with NIH support.

Trainees interested in the PNIRS-Scholar Award Program must register for the conference, submit an abstract, and check the designated box indicating an interest in this award when submitting their abstract online.

Ader & Cousins Award Nomination

When meeting registration and abstract submission opens for the Stockholm meeting on January 7th 2013, the PNIRS will be accepting nominations for the Dr. Robert Ader New Investigator Award and the Norman Cousins Award. The deadline for these nominations will be May 15th 2013. The outline for nomination requirements and eligibility will be summarized soon in the official "Call for Award Nominations" on the PNIRS website.

Initiating local PNIRS groups

With the purpose of promoting scientific exchange and collaboration between PNI research laboratories and institutions across Illinois and its surrounding states, Keith Kelley and colleagues from the University of Illinois initiated and supported the "Brain, Behavior, and Immunity Meetings of Illinois." This initiative, held in Chicago around the first weekend of December, has been very successful. Their 5th Annual Meeting was held November 30-December 1, attracting over 100 scientists.

This initiative can be taken as a prototype for further local initiatives and I was happy to hear that our colleagues in California and Colorado are currently considering a similar activity. The **G**erman-Endocrine-Brain-Immune-Network (GEBIN) was founded 15 years ago as a similar local (national) PNI-group with regular meetings and scientific activities. It is my experience over the years with GEBIN that these local groups are of extremely great value to promote local networking and subsequent scientific benefits.
